# From The Principal's Desk

Dear Parents and Carers,

It has been great to watch the roll out of the Positive Behaviour for Learning Program (Summerland Actions) across the College, and the impact it is having on behaviour and learning.

At a student enrolment meeting last week, I asked a student who was applying to enrol in the College why he wanted to change schools. He answered my question with the response, "I want to be in a school where students behave and the teachers can teach without constant interruptions." His clear answer reminded me of the importance of explicitly teaching school expectations to establish and maintain a learning environment where teachers are free to teach and students are free to learn.

In preparing a presentation to our staff on maximising individual academic performance, I was encouraged by some outstanding College results in the 2015 National testing program. One result that interested me was the score in Year 7 Reading. In this area, Summerland Christian College was the highest scoring school in Australia when compared to like schools. This was of particular interest to me as an educator as parents often look to move their students at Year 7 to larger schools with a wide range of curriculum offerings. Current research and the results of Summerland support the notion of maintaining educational continuity in the middle years of schooling and the benefits of a smaller school culture where students are known and nurtured individually.

An integral element is that students LEARN TWICE each part of their summary – that is, they go over and learn it once and then, within 24-48 hours, go back and learn it again. Research shows that this type of learning increases recall of facts by up to 80%.

# **ATTENDANCE – GENERAL INFORMATION**

#### Why must I send my child to school?

The law in NSW (Education Act 1990) states that all children between the ages of six and seventeen years (some exemptions apply for students 16 - 17 years of age) are required to attend school regularly.

It is the responsibility of parents or caregivers to make sure that their children attend school every day. A typical school day starts with roll call at 9.10am and finishes at 3:00pm. Supervision is provided from 8:15am

#### Must I send my child to school every day?

YES. It is your responsibility to send your child to school every day. If your child is absent from school, you must bring in a written explanation as soon as you send the child back to school. Our rolls are legal documents and if this explanation is not received within seven [7] days of the absence, the absence is permanently recorded as being unexplained and cannot legally be changed.

There are very few 'good', or legitimate, reasons for keeping your child away from school. Your explanation must be specific (not simply "family reasons" or "personal reasons"), and will only be considered satisfactory if:

- your child is too sick to go to school
- your child has been injured
- your child has to attend a special religious ceremony
- your child has an infectious illness for example, chicken pox, mumps or measles
- there is a serious family situation which requires their involvement

It is not however, acceptable to keep your child away from school for activities such as: birthdays, pension days, shopping, minding other children, hair cuts, unauthorized holidays etc.

#### Must my child attend sport?

YES. Sport and other exercise help the healthy physical development of children. Sport is part of normal school activity which students must attend.

If your child is unable to attend their sport for sick or injury reasons a note is to be provided explaining the relevant problem and handed to the sports coordinator at the start of the day. The sports coordinator will advise the student of the arrangements for that day.

Students are not given permission to go home.

#### Why is regular attendance at school important?

Attending school every day makes learning easier for your child and helps build and maintain friendships with other children. If students miss the basic skills in the early years of school, they may have problems later on. Regular attendance at school will help your child to succeed in later life.

Families should try to arrange holidays during school vacation periods. If you can only arrange your family holiday during school time, you should inform the school principal in advance and request permission for your child to be absent. You can ask the school to provide homework that can be completed while your child is absent. Given sufficient time, the teacher/s involved can usually arrange this.

#### What should I do if my child has to stay away from school?

It is important to let the school know when your child will be away and why your child is absent. The parent or caregiver should telephone the school or provide a written note addressed to the school explaining the child's absence.

If your child has to leave school during the day, you must send them in with a signed note clearly stating the child's name, Year, Roll group number, reason for the absence, times of departure and expected return. This note must then be handed in at the office before school. The leave pass is then collected at recess and handed back in on return to school.

Lunch passes may be applied for at the office but will only be issued to students who live within ten minutes walk from school and who go straight home for lunch. At least one parent is expected to be home at lunchtime. Passes must be carried and shown on request to teachers when either leaving and/or returning to the school grounds. If a student abuses the privilege, the pass will be withdrawn. Lunch pass students who are late back to school will have their pass withdrawn.

The details of students arriving late to school are also recorded in the rolls. If your child is late to school, it is your responsibility to send in a written explanation for the lateness. The student will have to sign the late book in the office and hand in the note from home.

#### My child won't go to school. What should I do?

You should contact the principal as soon as possible to discuss the problem and ask for help. The principal may ask a Home School Liaison Officer to contact you to discuss the issue.

We seek your support in helping your child to gain the greatest benefit from their education and developing good attitudes and practices in terms of meeting their responsibilities.
